




Sunday 16 October 2016 – World Food Day Zero Hunger, Zero Poverty Candlelight Vigil 7pm to 7.45pm at the Famine Statues, Custom House Quay, Dublin 1

In a symbolic walk, citizens and spiritual leaders created a human chain of lights between the Famine Statues and the Human Rights & Poverty Stone to #LightTheWay for Goal 1 and Goal 2 in the 2030 Univerval Sustainable Development Agenda. The event created a symbolic connection between World Food Day and End Poverty Day.









Tuesday 17 October – Custom House Quay, Dublin 1

Groups and students from all over the country build boats of hope that were officially launched on the river Liffey by David Donoghue, former Irish Ambassador to the UN and co facilitator for the 2030 Agenda. Each group also shared a message of hope at the Human Rights Stone before the launch.







Tuesday 17 October 2017 - Granard, Co. Longford


Lus Na Greine Family Resource Centre presented a community art installation 'The Web of Poverty'. The art piece was a multigenerational collaboration made from recycled produce.

Over 30 projects got support in 2017 from the Social Inclusion Division to raise awareness on the United Nations' Day for the Eradication of Poverty.



The youth group of Offaly Traveller Movement explored mental health in the Traveller community through the medium of film






Tuesday 17 October 2017 - Monaghan

Failte Isteach YWCA organised a very special Fashion Show to launch the project "Felt Against Poverty". Projects participants took part in 6 felting workshops and modelled their art during the fashion show; they also highlighted ways of tackling poverty around the world.









Wednesday 11 October 2017 – Mulhuddart, Dublin

I-Smile International organised an Interactive workshop that provided a platform for people in poverty to share their stories. The workshop also included a drama presentation "the Dark Tunnel" highlighting different barriers to participation and active citizenship.

In October 2016, I-Smile International held a motivational event for young people and showcased a drama highlighting the links between domestic violence and poverty. I-Smile International was also present at the 17 October gathering in Dublin.







Tuesday 17 October 2017 – Cork Life Centre, Cork
